We hope you will enjoy this bumper edition of the Arnold Foundation Review. It records the progress we have made to date, the celebrations to mark our tenth anniversary and reminds us of some highlights of the first ten years.

There is certainly much to celebrate. Many lives have been transformed and the School has firmly established means tested support for 10% of its pupils through the Lawrence Sheriff bequest (for day pupils) or through the Arnold Foundation (for boarding pupils).

This was our aim when the Foundation was launched in 2003 and we are thrilled that it has been achieved. More than £16 million has been raised and next September we will have

accredited schools, including Rugby, and 50 further state and independent boarding schools working towards accreditation, SpringBoard will transform many 1000s of lives over time.

So our aim for the next ten years is to develop and sustain a programme that is making a massive difference to so many lives and to raise the funds to support our ambitions. All gifts are used to fund Arnold Foundation pupils coming from the UK except where there is dedicated support through the



42 Arnold Foundation pupils in the School and 100 who have benefited; all made possible by the huge generosity of our donors, our partner organisations and the commitment of Rugby School staff. It is a remarkable achievement and supplements the existing Rugby School scholarship and bursary schemes which already benefit 204 pupils.

For the future we need to ensure we sustain this. Our founder is leaving and the Arnold Foundation is his legacy; we are extremely grateful to Patrick Derham for his vision and energy. As a permanent tribute the Governing Body and Arnold Foundation Board are establishing the Patrick Derham Bursary Award and hope that, with your support, we can create a named endowment fund to support Arnold Foundation pupils at the School. You will find more information on the third page of this Review.

Our programme is growing and there are 37 Arnold Foundation pupils at School today with 86 who have benefited to date. Work with 14 partner organisations, principally educational charities and schools, including our new partner The Clarion Voice in Leicester, continues to provide assistance in the identification of pupils and support to them and their families. The team at Rugby School now includes ten Arnold Foundation Tutors who support the pupils through their attachment to each of the boarding houses. With the expansion of the partner network, our Parent Liaison, which provides specific support to families, has grown to a team of four reflecting the number and geographical reach of Arnold Foundation recruitment.

2013 FACTS AND FIGURES

Rugby is one of the UK's leading co-educational boarding schools, founded in 1567, which maintains the tradition of innovation in all areas. It is an all round school which values academic excellence, service to the community and which seeks to broaden access and promote tolerance and understanding.

Pupils

In 2013/14 Rugby has 804 pupils between the ages of 11-18, of whom approximately 82% are boarding. There are 15 senior houses: 8 for boys and 7 for girls including 2 day houses and a separate day house for junior (11-13) pupils. The current boy: girl ratio is 55:45%.

Teaching Staff

With 102 teaching staff, Rugby's current pupil: teacher ratio is 8:1.

Fees

At September 2013, Rugby's fees are $\pm 10,415$ /term; $\pm 31,245$ p.a. for boarders and $\pm 6,535$ per term/ $\pm 19,605$ p.a. for day pupils (at 13+).

Scholarships and Bursaries

In 2013/14 246 pupils (31% of the total) will receive a scholarship or bursary at an estimated cost of \pounds 2.31 million.

Finances

- The School's July 2013 consolidated Balance Sheet showed net assets valued at £99.8 million, including School properties (at net book value) of £34.3 million and investments (at market value) of £65.5 million.
- The annual cost of running the School is approximately £22 million and the objective of meeting this from gross fee income is being achieved. The major elements of annual costs are teaching (approximately 43% of total), pupil welfare (18%), premises (28%) and support (11%).
- In 2012/13, the School's consolidated net incoming resources after scholarships, bursaries and prizes of £2.31 million was £2.748 million.

PARENT AMBASSADORS

Over the years, we have benefited greatly from the generous support of parents. The Parent Ambassadors embrace both present and past parents and work towards:

RUGBEIAN UNDER 30S


The other team engaged with Rugbeians and involving them in the work of the Arnold Foundation is the Rugbeian Under 30s Group.

As Patrick Derham prepares to leave Rugby School in the summer of 2014, the Governing Body of Rugby School and the Arnold Foundation Board are establishing the Patrick Derham Bursary Award as a fitting tribute to his founding of and contribution to The Arnold Foundation for Rugby School and in recognition of his time as Head Master.

Our aim is simple, to establish an endowment fund with the income used each year to support an Arnold Foundation pupil at Rugby School. We will need investment of at least £750,000 to provide the funding required and generous donors have already pledged £300,000 which is a fabulous start.

As Patrick Derham does not want a gift for himself anyone planning to make a leaving gift is asked, instead, to donate to this fund. Those who have heard him speak, or know something about his background, will be aware that social mobility is not an abstract concept for him.

The award will be known as the Patrick Derham Bursary Award. Pupil beneficiaries will be selected for their considerable potential and will come from IntoUniversity, where Patrick Derham is Deputy Chair of Trustees and which was our first partner organisation operating first in London but now with centres in the South West and East Midlands. The first pupil to benefit from this fully funded award will join the School in September 2014.

We hope we can rely on the further support from Arnold Foundation donors, Rugbeians, current parents, former parents and other friends of the School.


The Appeal is underway and your donations are invited.

"My father was a soldier and after he left the Army my family moved to a council estate in the Borders of Scotland where my mother still lives. When I was 12 I was a pupil on board a four masted ship, owned by the Shaftesbury Homes and moored on the River Medway at Lower Upnor in Kent, known as the Training Ship Arethusa. The plan was for me to join the Navy aged 16 but in October 1973 my life was turned upside down when through charitable support I found myself at Pangbourne College. So instead of leaving school at 16 I went on to read history at Cambridge. I can say with confidence that without this opportunity I would not be sitting at the desk of my celebrated predecessor, Dr Arnold, who himself was a passionate believer in the redemptive power of education.

My experience means that I am wholeheartedly committed to widening access. I believe that all our schools have a duty to give as many young people as possible similar life-changing opportunities. I passionately believe in giving every boy and girl I can the opportunity to dream dreams and to become as Michael Gove expressed so powerfully, "the authors of their own life stories."



I will continue to be eternally grateful for this opportunity, because it has opened doors for me and more importantly had substantial positive effects that rippled right through my family into my local community. Both Rugby and IntoUniversity gave me the tools to transform my life and I think it is amazing that both charities are expanding. Hopefully they will be able to reach others that were in a similar position as myself and be able to offer them that same life changing opportunity.

Francesca Oroma Odongkara (G 05-07) graduated from Loughborough University in 2011 with a BSc in Design and Materials Engineering. She is currently working as a Traffic Management Coordinator at FM Conway for the London Highways Alliance Contract.

I am now in a job which requires a level of education, skills and interests I only had a chance to develop while at Rugby and with the help of so many people who are involved in the Foundation. Rugby has had such a huge impact on my academic, professional and personal life that [had I not attended the School] I can only guess I would be a completely different (and not necessarily a better) person.

REMEMBERING YOUR WILL . . . AND WHO TO REMEMBER IN IT

The most important thing about a Will is to make one.

Important also is the inclusion of all those who will benefit including your family, friends and charities. However, we very much hope you will also remember The Arnold Foundation for Rugby School.

All gifts will make a difference and even an initial £250 legacy would be a wonderful start.

Over the years you may decide to pledge more and it is easy to change the amount, either by a simple Codicil or Letter of Wishes giving your executors guidance on dealing with your estate.

If you give all to your surviving spouse there is no inheritance tax. However a simple letter asking your spouse to donate to the Arnold Foundation would attract gift aid. This would give the Foundation more and cost the family less if your spouse is a higher rate tax payer.

If you have a SIPP you may draw down from the fund during your lifetime and your surviving spouse may continue in the same vein after your death. However the fund remaining on the survivor's death is taxed at a huge 55% after which it can be distributed as you may have directed. If you instruct that the Arnold Foundation is to benefit then the 55% tax is avoided.

When making your Will you should do so with the assistance of your solicitor. If you need more information or would like to make a specific bequest do please contact Kerry Wilson in the Development Office.
