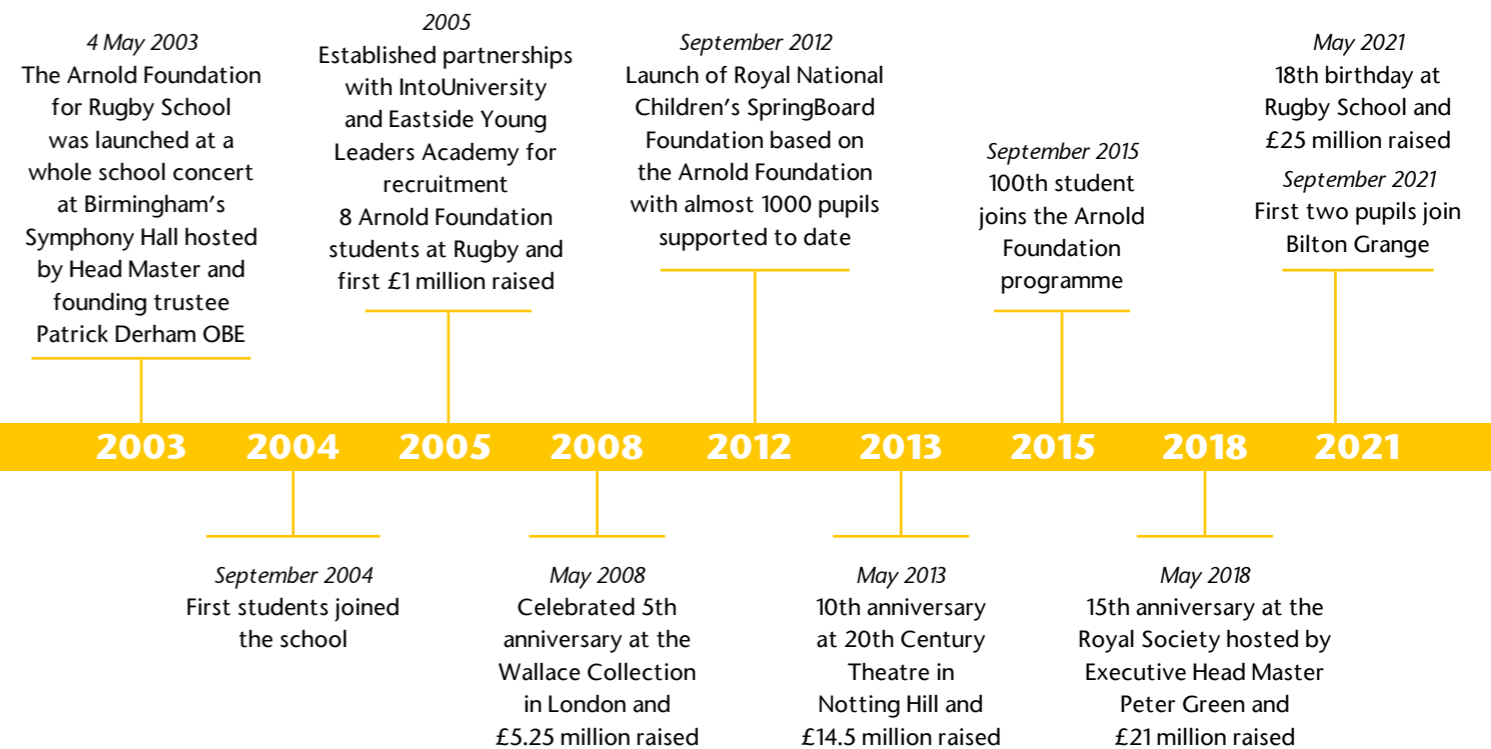

## The first 18 years

Eighteen years ago, when it was launched, The Arnold Foundation was a revolutionary programme. Today, it is a source of immense pride and an intrinsic part of the School's ethos. It has amplified the positive impact of Rugby School, changed the lives of many deserving students and hopes to provide opportunities for many more in the coming years.

## Our future – Fast Forward to 2030

In May we launched Fast Forward, an ambitious campaign to increase the number of Arnold Foundation students at Rugby School at any one time to 40.

I am confident this will be achieved. Not only by energetic and imaginative fund-raising and the support of you, our generous donors, but by spreading the word about the Arnold Foundation – the value of the Rugby education it provides, and the values with which it was founded – and which it continues to promote. It is an integral part of the School. I am personally deeply committed to that goal, now more than ever. I am happy to say that Bilton Grange, which merged with Rugby School in January 2020, welcomed its first two Arnold Foundation students in September.

One of the reasons the Arnold Foundation is, in my opinion, the leader in independent UK schools' bursary programmes, is that, from the selection process, through support at school and our links with families, we work hard to ensure that, with sensitivity and encouragement, an Arnold Foundation student receives a life-transforming experience: academic challenge in the classroom; the chance to participate in dozens of sports, artistic pursuits, and societies; the safe harbour of their House where they can develop friendships and have fun. It is only available to students who will live with us because we believe that boarding is the best way to allow Arnold Foundation students to enjoy the adventure and rewards of school to the full.

In 2017 we opened Rugby School Thailand. This will be followed by Rugby School Japan in 2023. I hope the family will grow. We choose our partners carefully. While we respect their cultural differences, we ensure that our overseas partners subscribe to our 'whole person, whole point' approach to education and pastoral care, and that they understand our philanthropic ethos. Our objective is to provide a first-class British education.

Alongside that goal, we make it clear to our investors and overseas partners that we hope they will introduce a bursary programme similar to the Arnold Foundation for the Rugby Schools in their own countries.

*Just as we are prudent in choosing our partners for establishing Rugby School in other countries, so we take great care in establishing and nurturing our relationships with those schools and charities in the UK who help us identify students who will benefit from the Arnold Foundation.*

Over the next year I shall be inviting those organisations to visit the School to see just how much we have grown, how much we have achieved, since the establishment of the Arnold Foundation and since they sent us their first students. We shall also be introducing Rugby to potential new partners across the UK, identifying the people who share our commitment to giving opportunities to disadvantaged children, children with determination, potential and curiosity, to attend a boarding school like ours.

The best ambassadors for the Arnold Foundation are the students. Their achievements are impressive; they tell their stories frankly and modestly, often with humour. They recognise what attending Rugby School means for their futures; we acknowledge the contribution they make to the whole school community – while they are with us and after they have left us. You can meet some of them on these pages. I know how interested you are in their progress.

Lockdown gave us all plenty of opportunity to reflect. Throughout all those months when the campus was silent, I reflected on what makes Rugby School so distinctive. It is the community. A school is more about the who than the what. Our students, past and present; our dedicated staff; our parents, past and present; our supporters and donors; our friends.

The Arnold Foundation is a demonstration of all that is good about Rugby School. It embodies the spirit of giving to, and of giving back. With your generosity, it will continue to flourish.

## Case studies



**Michael Odunsi joined Rugby (School Field) in 2010, from St Bonaventure's boys' school in London, and left in 2015.**

He graduated from the University of Manchester with First Class Honours in Management (International Business Economics) and works at JP Morgan in UK Energy, Power, Renewables & Mining Investment Banking.

"I was encouraged to apply for an Arnold Foundation place at Rugby by one of my mother's friends, whose son, also at my school, had successfully done so. I was 12 and thought 'School is school, why would I want to go to another one?' I remember my first visit – the English block was the same size as my entire school in London! Rugby was a different school! I had never done an interview so didn't know how to behave, and had no idea how I'd done. I remember the day the letter arrived – when I got home from school, my mum said 'It's under your pillow' and I was sure I hadn't got in. I had already looked at all the activities Rugby offered and chosen which ones I'd do!

"My brother and sisters came with my mother to drop me off on my first day. They thought being at boarding school meant I wouldn't be coming home for five years!

"The first thing I noticed was the highly organised day, the strict routines. Supper was at the same time every day – what if I wasn't hungry? But I soon got used to it and being busy all day. I had played football at school and tag rugby – not the real thing, of course. I carried on with the football and also started to play rugby and ended up in both the First teams.

"I was drawn to economics and science so I joined those societies. I tried to play the drums but that didn't work for me. I liked the community work – teaching primary school children, especially. In the Sixth Form I was impressed by the speakers who visited Rugby to talk about their careers. I was also struck by the careers advice given by the parents of boys in my House.

"I keep up with my Rugby friends, with the Arnold Foundation and, in my own mentoring of school children, encourage them to challenge anyone who says 'My way is the right way'."

**Michael**



**Grant Cumming joined Rugby in the LXX from Hawick High School (then, in 2011, a new partner) and was one of its first cohort.**

"I have a vivid memory of seeing the students when I came to Rugby for my interview – wearing tweed blazers! Carrying their books in their arms rather than in bags!

"Six days of classes was a bit of a shock, but the sport was great – I played rugby, badminton, football and also swam. I would have played rugby for the whole year but in those days you had to pick a new sport every term.

"The level of academic support was impressive, especially as teachers were on hand during evenings and at weekends and were always ready to help.

"I knew early on that chemistry was my subject, closely followed by computing. The Rugby labs were amazing both in terms of space and equipment. We got to do real practical experiments – in my old school, more experiments had been demonstrated.

"I went to Edinburgh University to read Chemistry and stayed on to do a five-year Master's, which included a four-week exchange programme with Tianjin University in China. This was a wonderful experience, including not only two hours a day studying Chinese language and culture but also working in a research lab for the first time.

"I'm now at Strathclyde University doing a PhD in Optical Medical Imaging with Healthcare Innovation and Entrepreneurship. This includes healthcare technology, ethics and regulation, business management and accountancy, giving me a skill set that I hope will be transferable anywhere in the world, using technology to connect clinicians, researchers and patients."

**Grant**



**Lady-Cigourney Tetley joined Bradley in 2013 for the Sixth Form, via IntoUniversity which worked closely with her church.**

“I wondered why I needed to board, but soon realised how great it was to be able to see my teachers at any time. People smarter than me were working really hard so I worked hard too. I loved being busy but Rugby was a different kind of busy (Saturday lessons!). And there was so far to walk between classes! I loved hockey – dangerous but fun – and tai chi, which calmed me down. I missed Ghanaian food so a Muslim friend (whose mum cooked her halal curries) and I went back to school on the train from London with big freezer bags of our own food. I went to Liverpool University to read English Literature with Business because I wanted to use both sides of my brain.

“In 2017 the Grenfell Tower fire changed my life. My family lived on the estate and I had friends there. Theresa May, then the PM, visited the site and I met her in my family’s flat with other survivors. I was very wound up but was encouraged by her staff to tell her truly what I felt about the slow response to the disaster, the rehousing, where children would go to school, what would happen about their exams. She listened, but there is still more to do.

“I realised I could not go back to university immediately. I wanted to help at Grenfell. In the end, I did get a 2.1. Mrs May wrote to ask

how I did in my Finals and asked me if I would like to work at the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting. She said the Civil Service needed people like me. I was then invited to work at the Department for International Trade on the GREAT campaign. These were amazing opportunities. And then I joined the COP26 team, as their Digital Co-Lead, which has been a tough, intense two years and taught me so much. I’ve even made my family change their eating habits and sold my car! None of these posts were in my plan. I have learned so many new skills.”

**Tshanda is the mother of a current Arnold Foundation student.**

“My daughter went to primary school in Leicester, and moved to secondary school there. We were not happy with either school as we knew she was academically bright but the teachers were paying more attention to the children who were struggling or disruptive. The clever children were left to look after themselves and often felt guilty for being smart.

“We were recommended to approach Clarion Education, a charity that advances the education of under-privileged children in mainstream schools in the Leicester area, and they directed us towards the Arnold Foundation at Rugby. I was anxious that, should she get in, she would feel out of place but right from the interview and induction day they made her – and us – feel comfortable and relaxed.

“There had been limited activities at her old school so we were pleased that as well as the academic side, at Rugby she was afforded the opportunity to expand her interests. The extra activities filled the spaces that needed to be filled in her life – all in one environment. She played the violin, took up the piano, started hockey which she had not played before, and has made some amazing friends.

“During lockdown, Rugby was so supportive. When her laptop broke, the school immediately sent a technician who had it repaired within a day.

“Even if you are confident about the school, as a parent you feel you are handing over your child. The Arnold Foundation and Rugby have always made me feel that my place in my child’s life is respected; they have supported us from the start, and I am grateful, too, for their standards of privacy and confidentiality in all our dealings.”



**Kevin joined F Block in 2008, via IntoUniversity. He is now a teacher at Phoenix Academy in West London, teaching Economics at A-level to years 12 and 13 and Physics from year 10 to 12.**

“My mum and I were both worried about the boarding aspect of going away to school but she wanted the best education for me, and I had always been independent. I was a boy from inner London so one of my first impressions of Rugby was the beautifully kept sports grounds. I signed up for rugby, football and athletics right away and was thrilled to be part of the athletics team that made it to the English Schools finals.

“In the Lower XX I decided I wanted to become an investment banker. Rugby organised a two-week work experience for me at Barclays Capital. I liked the work but knew office life was not for me.

“I read Law and Economics at Kent University and stayed on to do a Master’s in Business Management. I was the first person in my family to go to university. After all that study, I went travelling and ended up in Thailand where I got a job as a teacher – my first proper job – and I decided that was the career for me. I taught in Thailand for two years then came back to the UK to do my PGCE.

“I realise that my approach to teaching is based on Mr Bryant who taught me Economics at Rugby. He was calm and clear. And of course the time management skills you learn at Rugby, and the importance of structure, have been invaluable.

“The first student I saw when I went to Rugby to do my interview was Isaak Williams, whom I had known since I was nine years old. He too had gone to Rugby as an Arnold Foundation student via IntoUniversity. It seemed a good sign. And we are still good friends.”

# The 18th birthday year

An enormous thank you to everyone who have been contributing to our 18th birthday year and especially to those who donated auction prizes, bid generously, signed up for regular donations, pledged to include the Arnold Foundation in their wills and made generous birthday gifts. The following are some highlights of our 18th birthday year:

## Telethon

The Telephone Campaign in June 2021 was a terrific opportunity for 12 young Rugbeians (including two former Arnold Foundation students) to speak to other members of the Rugby Community about the work of the Foundation. Working from home, the callers made more than 500 calls, updated records, picked up some fantastic career advice and were wonderful ambassadors for the School. The total raised over ten years will be around £250,000, thanks to the generosity of our donors.



## Wine Auction

In June we worked with Sotheby's Wine and some of our very generous supporters to consign a fabulous collection of beautiful wines and outstanding experiences which were auctioned to raise funds as part of our 18th Birthday Celebration.

Amongst the lots we had a huge variety of wine but the auction wasn't just limited to bottles! We also had a range of wonderful experiences including a private dinner with wine legend Hugh Johnson OBE and an exclusive VIP tour and tasting hosted by Saskia de Rothschild (B 00-01) at her family's estate, Chateau Lafite-Rothschild.

After some intense bidding the auction concluded with a whopping £134,000 donation as part of our 18th Birthday Celebration.

## Celebration Dinner and Auction

The Arnold Foundation's 18th Birthday Celebration Dinner brought some much-needed glitter and sparkle back to Rugby after a two-year period of enforced seclusion. The Collingwood Centre was transformed with lights, drapes, flowers and fire-eaters into a party venue for 180 lucky guests. Following inspirational speeches from former Arnold Foundation students Saqlain Choudhary (M12-17) and David Ejim-McCubbin (K09-11), supporters bid very generously for fabulous donated prizes in the on-line auction, raising a magnificent £45,000.



## Scottish Friends of Rugby School

On Friday 12 November, Rugbeians, parents, friends of the School and current staff gathered at the New Club in Edinburgh for a fabulous evening.

Peter Green, Executive Head Master of the Rugby School Group, shared news from Rugby, and Eddie Gimlette (Sh 81-86) welcomed everyone to the first reunion of Scottish Friends in over 18 months.

It was great to be together again catching up with old friends, and making new ones, and to be joined by so many recent leavers who were studying at Edinburgh University.



## American Friends of Rugby School

The first virtual American Friends event featured a walk around the Rugby School campus with Executive Head Master Peter Green and included the Chapel, Old Big School and the fabulous new walkway joining Barby Road and Horton Crescent.

Another memorable video profiled two Arnold Foundation students, Efa and Shobs, who told us about their recent experiences on the Duke of Edinburgh Gold expedition and showed how important participation in activities throughout the school has been in shaping their futures and building their Whole Person Whole Point experience.

For most charity supporters, the legacy gift is the largest donation we will make. Very few of us feel fabulously wealthy in life, and yet after our death we can become extremely generous. Thank you to all who have pledged a gift in your Will.

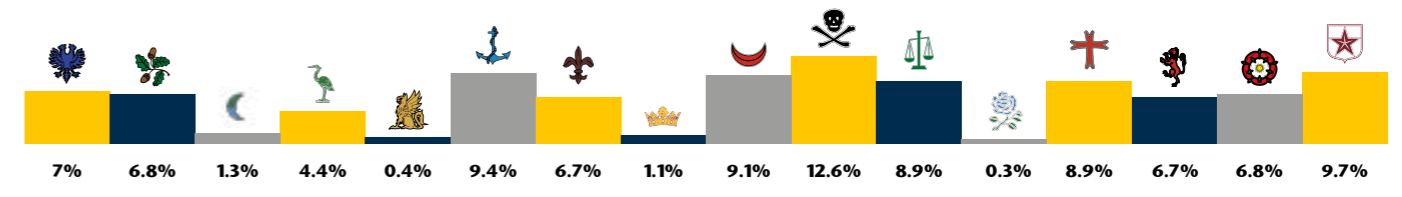
